Using our trailer helps reduce the chance of zebra mussels or other aquatic invasive species from entering the lake as the trailer is only used for Long Lake and Des Moines Lake.

Watercraft Decontamination Station

We had a successful Zoom meeting with association members and Ryan Knox and Amy Juers from Des Moines Lake Association. Members voted and approved the association joining the Des Moines Lake Association in a 50-50 joint project to build and operate a new watercraft decontamination station at the boat landing. The plan is to have the station operational by spring 2025.

Please see the project PDF presentation by clicking <u>here</u>. The presentation will provide more information about this important project to help strengthen our commitment to stopping the spread of aquatic invasive species, especially zebra mussels, into both lakes.

In addition to the environmental damage from zebra mussels, studies have shown that property values can be reduced by as much as \$20,000 for one hundred feet of shoreline once a lake has zebra mussels.

Annual Member Dues

The association board has approved an increase in the annual membership dues to \$50. The additional funds will help defray the operating expenses of the decontamination station. Loon Update

Long Lake was ice free 3/09/2024. This beats the most recent early ice off date of 3/23/2000.

Loons started arriving around April 3rd, with one loon in the north section. Lots of loons could be heard calling and chattering as they flew overhead upon arrival in our area. Glad to say that as of 4/11/2024 we now have the traditional loon pairs with 2 in each of the north, middle and south sections of Long Lake. The "couples" in each section seem to be settling in and we hope for a successful mating and chick hatching, growing into healthy young adults for this 2024 summer.

Nesting platforms will be placed in the usual areas in each of the 3 sections in early May.

July 2023, I accepted the role of LoonWatch Ranger, that is a program of the Sigurd Olson Environmental Institute at Northland College in Ashland, Wisconsin. I will be keeping records of the loon activity on Long Lake from spring arrival until fall departure. At the end of the season, I will mail in my monitoring forms to the LoonWatch Institute.
